In the supplies at the site will be included precontact and post-contact solutions and an ID sheet. There should be little contact if everyone is using grabbers and has their legs covered! There is no bathroom along the trail the nearest would be a business along MLK or Euclid. It is also recommended to bring water, sunscreen, and bug spray.
